### Natalie Nanzia Singo

I'm 15 and I go to Hudson High School. I want to do music or makeup when I'm done with school. I love dancing and playing volleyball. I've been going to Holy Trinity since I was 7, after I moved from Tanzania. I love sleeping, singing, and dancing.

Anita, Josiah, and Natalie have participated in confirmation instruction for more than three years now, including Sunday morning classes, retreats, trips, and special events. They have been supported and encouraged by family members, sponsors and a wonderful team of confirmation teachers, including Pastor Andrea and Emma Kasiga. During the first weekend in October they took part in an Urban Immersion service retreat through the Greater Minneapolis Council of Churches. This program seeks to create a deeper understanding of the complexities of poverty through team-building activities and critical reflection. The students found the weekend to be a meaningful experience, filled with simulations, learning, service, and fellowship.

Final preparation during this last week will include a dinner and discussion with Pastors Hans and Andrea on the eve of confirmation. Younger confirmation students will be hosting the coffee hour in their honor, following the Rite of Confirmation at the 11:00 service.
