HOLY WEEK

Our Palm Sunday procession began a day early this year as we followed the sure-footed steps of our teenagers as they marched for their lives and called for common sense gun reforms at the Capitol. Their voices were strong—calling us to recognize that the epidemic of gun violence, while it touches all of us, disproportionately affects communities of color and indigenous communities. Their moral compasses were faithful—pointing us toward a vision of a more just and peaceful tomorrow.

We kept following the lead of our youngest members on Sunday morning. The Godly Play and Trinity Village students carried papier-mâché masks of people who have brought justice into the world. The faces of Ruby Bridges, Helen Keller, Martin Luther King, Jr., Winona LaDuke, Mother Teresa, Harriet Tubman, Jesus of Nazareth, Malala Yousafzai—and even our own Bud and Sylvia Dixen—joined the procession as we shouted, “Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!”

This Thursday evening, the congregation’s teenagers once again invite us to take brave steps as we move further into our observance of Holy Week. We gather for a simple soup supper at 5:30 p.m. in the Community Room, followed by a Service of Holy Communion at 7:00 p.m. in the Bartsch Room (the chapel on Holy Trinity’s ground level). Worshipers are invited to participate in foot-washing, as an act of vulnerability and solidarity with one another and with all those whose feet are made weary by injustice around the world. (Please don’t let this invitation keep you away on Thursday evening; for a variety of reasons, many choose to forego the foot-washing. There is no coercion, no shame attached to the invitation.)

Good Friday’s worship service at 7:00 p.m. in the Bartsch Room tells the story of Jesus’ Passion. The cross stands at the center of our gathering, and we grieve Jesus’ death at the hands of those who feared his equitable vision. This night invites us to reflect honestly and to voice our lives’ laments in the company of the whole community. We leave the service in silence, acknowledging the deep pain in our lives, in the lives of our siblings around the world, and in all of creation, cannot be quickly fixed. Even so, we trust in the resurrection promises given to us.

The Vigil of Easter on Saturday at 7:00 p.m. in the Bartsch Room is one of our most playful and meaningful services of the year. This year, members of all ages will tell the stories of creation, Noah and the flood, and deliverance at the Red Sea. There will be singing, acting, and laughing. Everyone will be a part of the telling in some small way (read: there will be props). Halfway through the service, we’ll move from the shadows of the Bartsch Room into a vision of the resurrection in the Sanctuary. There the meal of Holy Communion will be shared, and Robin Olsen Biebighauser will be baptized and welcomed into the community of Christ.

It’s a full week. It’s an important week. It’s a week that invites all of us, as followers of Jesus, to be led by the One who calls us into justice, vulnerability, mercy, truth-telling, love, and life. So, come, you who have much faith and you who would like to have more; you who have tried to follow Jesus and you who have failed; you who depend on these sacred stories and you for whom they are still new and strange. There is room enough for all.
