GET READY TO INNOVATE!

We are thrilled to announce that Holy Trinity has been awarded a grant through Augsburg University's Riverside Innovation Hub! We are joining 15 other local faith communities in an opportunity to partner and learn together through the Innovative Ministry Partnership and explore innovative place-based ministry with young adults where public life and faith intersect.

This is a four-year commitment, and an Innovation Hub Core Team of 4-5 Holy Trinity members, along with Pastor Ingrid, will take the lead in this new partnership. We will be welcoming and working with a young adult Innovation Coach assigned and compensated by Augsburg to be with us 20 hours each week for the 2018/2019 school year. They will guide us through a process of exploring who we are as a community, how we engage in relationships, and how we can deepen our engagement, particularly with people in their 20s. By the spring of 2019, we will develop a proposal for how we would like to do this work and will receive up to \$30,000 to support the ideas for deeper ministry that we identify during the first year. We will continue partnering with Augsburg and other local faith communities as we experiment, adapt, and implement our proposal, and the Innovative Ministry Partnership officially ends December 2021.

There is much yet to be revealed about how this opportunity will take shape, how it will challenge us, and how it will help us grow as a community. We anticipate that there will be many ways for those interested to participate as we move forward. We are excited about the possibilities, and look forward to sharing more with you as we learn.

The application process was a collaborative venture that involved many Holy Trinity members and staff, and included many written responses and a video response. Hannah Rector, Laura Bolstad, Karen Kunze, Nicki Hines, Meghan Olsen Biebighauser, Meagan McLaughlin, and Pastor Ingrid all contributed to responding to application questions by writing and collecting video clips of our community and our many partners. Several others shared their ideas and experiences on video as well. The James Dunn Estate gift provided \$200 to compensate videographer Paul Nixdorf for many hours of expert work compiling video clips to create the video portion of the application. Thank you to everyone who worked so hard to make this possible!

Hannah, Laura, Karen, and Pastor Ingrid will be joined by a couple of additional people to form Holy Trinity's Core Team by the end of the summer, and we will officially welcome our Core Team and our Innovation Coach in early fall!

JULY 1 "Biblical Concept of Home" Joyce Besser

This summer during the adult education hour, we'll be dedicating our attention to racial justice in housing. We'll learn about the past and present of housing segregation in Minneapolis. We'll talk about faithful responses to gentrification. We'll think together about how racism in housing affects education, policing, and quality of life. We'll consider biblical and theological conceptions of "home," learn about concrete obstacles in our city and neighborhood, and hear from people who are working to improve access. We trust that this topic is worthy of your sustained attention, and we welcome your voice.

JULY 8 "Beyond Diversity 101: Micro-inequities, Implicit Bias, and Moving Toward Equity" Anne Phibbs, PhD, Founder and President of Strategic Diversity Initiatives.

Anne brings over 25 years of experience helping organizations advance their equity, diversity, and inclusion goals. She is adept at assessing an organization's strengths and challenges and tailoring her approach to its context, culture, and goals. Many of us have been involved with diversity training that focuses on cultural difference and respecting all perspectives. While this is a good start, we cannot move toward true equity in our workplaces, organizations, and personal relationships until we address historical and institutional inequality. In order to address the myriad ways that certain people are marginalized based on social identities such as race, gender, disability, religion, class, sexual orientation, etc., every one of us needs to understand our own identities, how we all demonstrate bias that is often unconscious, and how we are all capable of moving toward equity.
