REFUGEE FAMILY ARRIVING SOON

On a recent Sunday, guest preacher Rev. Eleanor Hunsberger urged us to “reach out in compassion and love to all whom Jesus sends our way.” Well, a family of nine “new Americans” is coming our way in a few short weeks and we will be welcoming them with compassion and love. And stuff. And help registering their children for school, learning how to take the bus, getting medical care, signing up for English classes, opening a bank account, and many other things they will be doing as they adjust to their new lives here. In this case, “love” is definitely a verb.

A little bit about the family: The parents fled persecution in Burma in 1997 and have lived in the Mae Lo Oon refugee camp (Google that to see a video tour of the camp!) on the Thailand/Burma border for the last 21 years. They have 3 daughters (ages 2, 4 and 20) and four sons (ages 8, 12, 14 and 17.) Another baby is due in December. As far as we know, the wife’s father and a sister have recently settled in St. Paul. The family is Christian.

How can you help with this important work? Holy Trinity co-sponsors the family, along with the Minnesota Council of Churches’ (MCC) refugee resettlement program. Our commitment is for four months. Past experience has taught us that the first month or so is the busiest. A core team of a dozen Holy Trinity members has formed to organize our work. If you are not on that team but would like to help out, there are ways you can help with one-time, short-term tasks! Our first task is to prepare and furnish an apartment before the family arrives on August 30. Donations of selected furniture and household goods are welcome—watch for the sign-up sheet on the Community Room table or contact Deb Sodt or the church office. Our next most urgent task will be to prepare a living space for the family. MCC will find an apartment. It will probably be on the East Side of St. Paul. If you can spare a few hours toward the end of August, we can use your help with cleaning and moving in. We need some younger people with strong muscles and a couple of folks with trucks or vans for transporting things. Contact Martha Mueller or the church office if you can help with this.

Thanks to the prior leadership of Dave Moe and the hard work of our previous refugee resettlement teams, Holy Trinity has earned the respect of MCC over the years by working well with large families or those who face particular challenges. We are grateful for the generosity and energy in our congregation that makes that possible!
