THEME THREE: HOSPITABLE FACILITIES

“Moved by the Spirit” is the theme of our fall stewardship emphasis. This theme seeks to capture what many of you have recently articulated—that is, that the Spirit of the Living God is at work at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church.

We asked elected leaders, committees, working groups, and staff this question: “As this congregation looks toward the budgeting process for 2019, are there ministry initiatives that you feel called to undertake, but don’t currently have the funds to complete?” Their responses centered around three primary goals: ministry excellence, racial justice, and hospitable facilities. Below are the goals that relate most closely to hospitable facilities:

- Do you know that not-for-profit groups from the community use our building free of charge approximately 120 times each year? Neighborhood groups and church groups alike would benefit from conference room tables that would facilitate great conversations for everyone who meets at Holy Trinity.
- We continue to make strides to ensure that people with differing mobility can worship with ease in our sanctuary. In 2019 we would like to make modifications to one or two pews that would allow someone using a wheelchair and their loved one(s) to sit shoulder-to-shoulder.
- If you bike to church, it comes as no surprise that the bike racks are often at capacity on Sunday mornings. Let’s install a few more and further our commitment to caring for the Earth.
- We have a large and complex building. Let’s make it easier for people unfamiliar with Holy Trinity to enter the building and navigate its hallways once they’re inside. Signage matters.

Please plan to join us in the lower level gymnasium for our annual Stewardship Sunday continental breakfast and program in between services this Sunday, October 14. This week we will also invite congregants to present commitment cards in worship. All active households will receive a commitment card, along with a review of the ministry goals, by mail. Thank you for prayerfully considering your financial commitment to the work of this congregation.

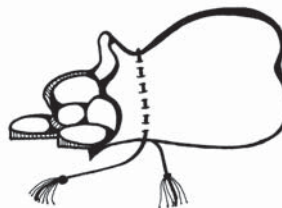
