RACIAL JUSTICE PARTNERSHIPS

Holy Trinity's working group on Racial Justice has identified and connected with three organizations with roots in our community that are led by people of color. The working group intends for Holy Trinity to come alongside these three organizations to learn about their work, amplify their message, and show up with them in the community.

These three organizations are:

- 1. Council on American-Islamic Relations, Minnesota (CAIR-MN): CAIR-MN's primary mission is to "enhance the understanding of Islam, encourage dialogue, protect civil liberties, empower American Muslims, and build coalitions that promote justice and mutual understanding." They engage with the media, provide community trainings, and promote justice to protect the rights of Minnesota Muslims.
- 2. Centro de Trabajadores Unidos en la Lucha (CTUL): CTUL organizes low-wage workers from across the Twin Cities to develop leadership and educate one another to build power and lead the struggle for fair wages, better working conditions, basic respect, and a voice in our workplaces. CTUL is an organization of workers and for workers, committed to securing fair working conditions for present and future generations. Holy Trinity has been a partner of CTUL for years, but the Racial Justice working group wants to renew focus on this relationship.
- 3. Village Financial Cooperative/Blexit/Association for Black Economic Power: After the shooting of Philando Castille, Twin Cities residents formed Blexit to practice economic civil resistance and to offer people the chance to divest from banking institutions that uphold white supremacy. They then formed the Association for Black Economic Power (ABEP) to execute banking strategies and work between financial institutions and community activists. Village Financial Cooperative is the financial institution that grew from these commitments. Inspired by Holy Trinity's commitment to investing in Village Financial Cooperative, a black-owned credit union developing in North Minneapolis, the racial justice working group wants Holy Trinity to back up our financial investment with action.

Keep an eye out for communications from the working group on Racial Justice as these partnerships continue to unfold.
