RACIAL JUSTICE STATEMENT: CREATING MANY RIPPLES

Is it just another piece of paper to file away or will it make a difference in the depth of our commitment to racial justice? On October 15, our Holy Trinity Council approved a motion that a Racial Justice Statement go forward for congregational adoption at our annual meeting in January 2019. Like other public commitments we make, such as proclaiming ourselves as a Reconciling in Christ congregation, it can be a foundational document that challenges us towards greater inclusion and equity. We also hope it will “ripple” through all aspects of our ministry.

The Racial Justice Statement is a response to the Minneapolis Area Synod’s request that all congregations create their own statements regarding racism and commitment to work for a more equitable world. The Statement declares that we will use a “racial justice lens to look at the way in which racism and white privilege shape our congregational life and our interface with our community.” It also is a call for continued action as we “actively pursue racial justice in ALL aspects of our congregational life.”

Over the past eight months, members of the Racial Justice Group met with every committee, work group, and our staff to secure feedback on the drafted statement. We are very grateful for the suggestions and the rich conversations that occurred. In many of these sessions ideas percolated on what actions we might take in the future to “better align our practices for being a racially just community.” To broaden our view we also consulted with other churches who developed statements and wove them into their congregational life.

We expect that the Holy Trinity Racial Justice Statement will not end up in a file, but will ripple through all areas of our ministry as we move towards being a racially just and beloved community. Watch for copies in the Community Room and again at the congregational meeting in January.

NOVEMBER 11 Reconciling in Christ Congregation —David Broberg, Holy Trinity Member

One of our current congregational goals (approved in 2018) invites us to grow in competency and commitment to issues of gender and sexuality in our congregation. The Church Council articulated several ways we might fulfill this goal, including: renewing our commitment as a Reconciling in Christ congregation; offering opportunities to learn about living healthy lives as sexual beings, whatever our orientation or identity, using the “Our Whole Lives” curriculum across age groups; and offering opportunities to learn about how life is experienced by people of various sexual orientations and gender identities.

To this end, the Adult Education Committee has created a series of forums entitled “Our Embodied Selves: De-Mystifying the LGBTQIA Alphabet Soup and Claiming Our Welcome” to help us grow in understanding and in relationship. Today, we begin by recommitting to hospitality as a Reconciling in Christ Congregation by:

- Exploring the reality of life for LGBTQIA people;
- talking about equality vs. equity, power, and privilege;
- embracing our role as a church committed to honoring difference;
- offering a brief introduction to four continuums: sex, gender identity, gender expression, and orientations; and
- breaking the binary around sex.

Today we continue our series on gender and sexuality with a conversation about breaking the binary around gender identity. We’ll talk about preferred pronouns (he/him/his; she/her/hers; they/them/theirs) and the gender identity continuum.
