## OUR WELCOMING JOURNEY

One of our congregational goals adopted earlier this year is that Holy Trinity will: **Grow in competency and commitment to issues of gender and sexuality in our congregation.** We could fulfill this goal by: *Renewing our commitment as a Reconciling in Christ congregation. Offering opportunities to learn about living healthy lives as sexual beings, whatever our orientation or identity, using the Our Whole Lives curriculum across age groups. Offering opportunities to learn about how life is experienced by people of various sexual orientations and gender identities.*

Over the last several weeks of adult forums we've been learning from representatives of partner organizations and from our own members about a variety of topics related to gender and sexuality. The conversations have been lively and wide-ranging, and I hope you'll consider joining us as we revisit this series in the spring.

In the new year, we'll gather a group that will lead us through renewing our commitment as a Reconciling in Christ congregation. That group will discern the path together, but one task will be to update or re-write our welcome statement.

One tangible outcome of these conversations is that we now offer pronoun stickers that we invite you to add to your Holy Trinity nametag, to indicate the personal pronouns that you use. From *Reconciling Works*: "Personal pronouns are the set of pronouns a person wants others to use when talking to or about them. Ask a person what pronouns they prefer. Remember: if someone is feminine presenting, it does not automatically mean they use she/her/hers pronouns. You cannot assume someone's pronouns based on the person's gender expression." If you choose to add a pronoun sticker to your nametag, you can find them on a small table near the nametag display wall.

I'm grateful for this community and look forward to working together as we reach new milestones in our Welcoming Journey. If you're interested in leadership in this area or just want to talk more, let me know.
