# REFLECTION ON FORGIVENESS from Sunday, December 30

#### Colossians 3:12-17

As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

Sometimes we treat forgiveness like we treat New Year's resolutions—we make a declaration, try to go at it alone, and wonder why our efforts to forgive end as abruptly as our daily workout routines.

It turns out that forgiveness is more like a long walk than a short sprint, more like a drippy faucet than a crashing wave. Forgiveness doesn't ask us for quick solutions; instead, it requires us to look closely, daily at the threads that extend from our hearts to the wider world and attend to the frayed pieces.

While the Apostle Paul may have been a prisoner of his time when it came to things like gender parity and the face of religious leadership, his understanding of the role of forgiveness in Christian community has proved timeless. He knew it was essential, that without it, no community—whether it was one day old or 115 years old—would have any chance of surviving.

This may make forgiveness sound like a work. And in some ways it is. You and I do have a part to play in this act of faith. Forgiveness is also a gift that we receive, often in community, through a Spirit who believes in long walks, drippy faucets, and hearts that are always under construction.
