AMMPARO

A relatively new Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) strategy/program is named "Accompany Migrant Minors with Protection, Advocacy, Representation and Opportunity," which briefly caught the attention of a related temporary task force here at Holy Trinity in 2017.

Recently, our Sanctuary Support Task Force wondered and prayed about the need for support of asylee applicants moving to our community. Then, through the combination of a member asking the ELCA to take some action at the Southern Border, and me contacting an attorney I've worked with at Advocates for Human Rights, we learned that both Minneapolis and St. Paul Synods are working with AMMPARO congregations in the area to train volunteers to accompany (migrant) unaccompanied minors in a new juvenile court to open here, hopefully by the fall. Therefore, a group of us, along with Pastor Ingrid, decided to apply to be an AMMPARO congregation. That means we agree to:

- Spiritually and pastorally accompany migrants in our community congregation;
- Physically accompany migrants as needed to medical, legal, and pastoral resources;
- Pray for the children and families who have migrated over the border;
- Prayerfully consider participation in ELCA advocacy.

In addition, we've identified bi-lingual (Spanish speakers) members as volunteers, if necessary, and a contact person for the ELCA National office and the Synod office (Connie Adams).

In an adult forum in September, our speaker will be a lawyer who volunteered at the border this summer. Also watch for information about a related book study coming in the next few months.

Please let me know if you'd like to be an active volunteer in the AMMPARO program!

ALL-GENDER BATHROOMS AT HOLY TRINITY

We believe every person is born beloved, and that includes their gender expression. We seek to practice that belief by creating inclusive spaces. The Church Council recently made the decision to designate the first-floor (one floor below the sanctuary level) bathrooms as single-use, all-gender bathrooms on Sundays and during other congregational events. Both bathrooms have locks on the exterior doors that indicate occupancy.

Who benefits from all-gender bathrooms?

People are uncomfortable in gender-specific rooms for many reasons; for example, people who do not identify as women or men, and/or people who are gender nonconforming; parents/caregivers; people with caregivers or personal attendants; and many others!
