MESSAGE FROM PASTORS

As the coronavirus (COVID-19) situation evolves, we are in conversation with the staff, Council leadership, and Holy Trinity's resident public health experts. We are also monitoring the CDCs recommendations and suggestions from the State of Minnesota.

We find ourselves at a crossroads. Minnesota is now recommending the suspension of public gatherings (large gatherings with 250+ people and smaller gatherings with fewer than 250 people that are held in settings that do not allow social distancing of six feet per person). Experts say that collective action may help to flatten the virus' growth curve, which, in turn, has the potential to decrease the risk to those most vulnerable to the disease (e.g., the aged, those will underlying health conditions).

It is out of our deep and abiding love for the neighbor that, effective immediately, we are cancelling Sunday and Wednesday worship, all programming, committee and working group meetings, choirs, and other events until April 1, 2020. We have been in conversation with our building partners, including MetroWork Center, Bright Prospects Cooperative Preschool, Lutheran Volunteer Corps, the Minnesota Swahili Christian Congregation, and local organizations that use our facility throughout the week. All of them have chosen to cease programming by Wednesday, March 18.

We know this will be hard news to digest, particularly for a congregation that prides itself for gathering every week even as blizzards rage around us! Gathering is central to our understanding of Christian community; so much life, hope, and love is created when we are together at Holy Trinity. We know that many of you depend on worship for sustenance; the gathering, the Word, and Holy Communion give you nourishment for life's journey.

We trust that God will continue to guide our ministry during this time. Watch your email, our website, and social media for weekly updates about online worship and other opportunities for connection. Our faithful staff will continue to serve, even as we sanitize and maintain the building. Some staff may choose to work remotely, and we encourage anyone who feels sick or vulnerable to stay home. As a matter of justice, we will continue to pay all employees, including hourly wage earners, even if hours shift.

One of the implications of canceling Sunday morning worship is that our regular offering will not be collected. It's essential to support our staff and keep current with our responsibilities. Even in the midst of uncertainty, we are called to be generous. Please mail your offering to the church or give electronically (click on the "donate" button at htlcmpls.org). Knowing that our income could be impacted, we invite those with extra resources to consider making a special gift.
