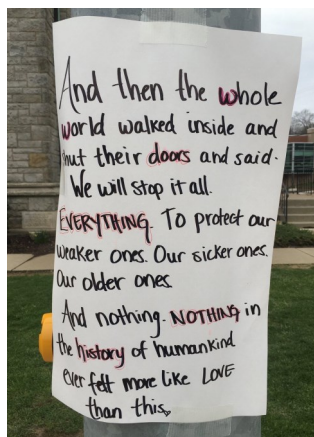
## PREPARING FOR HOLY WEEK

## PALM SUNDAY

### READINGS

Isaiah 50:4-9a, Psalm 31:9-16,  
Philippians 2:5-11, Matthew 21:1-11

### Saturday, April 11—Vigil of Easter

Keeping vigil on Easter eve is an ancient practice for the church. For centuries Christians have come together in vigil in darkness as night falls. The liturgy is multifaceted, rich, and playful. The Vigil is full of readings from scripture. We hear the slow unfolding of God's gracious activity in the world and among us. Twelve readings are appointed, not all of which are read each year, but as a whole they lift up some of the greatest moments of the history of God's salvific work—creation, flood, testing of Abraham, deliverance at the Red Sea, the gift of wisdom, the valley of dry bones, Jonah's encounter with the big fish, the deliverance from the fiery furnace, and more. Many Holy Trinity households are leading the storytelling this year!

### Sunday, April 12—Easter Sunday

Jesus is alive and with us! We gather online for a festival worship service of Holy Communion to celebrate this good news. We recently discovered recordings from our 2017 Easter worship service (thank you, Paul Rasmussen!); our video service will transport us to our favorite pew in the sanctuary. Christ is risen! Let us rejoice!

### Sunday, April 5—Palm Sunday

Online Worship with Holy Communion begins with shouts of Hosanna! As we recall Jesus' entry into Jerusalem to disrupt powers of violence and oppression.

### Thursday, April 9—Maundy Thursday

We begin our observance of the Three Days. The liturgy on this day contains the elements that define Christianity: the church announces that sins are forgiven; we approach one another and God in vulnerability through foot washing; money is collected for the care of the neighbor; and we share Holy Communion, the meal that celebrates the living presence of Jesus among us.

### Friday, April 10—Good Friday

The night's liturgy tells the story of Jesus' Passion. Tonight, we meet Jesus at the foot of the cross. As we grieve his death, we voice our lives' laments. Even in the sorrow of this day, we trust in the resurrection promises given to us. We leave tonight's service in silence. Immanuel Davis (flute) and Kathe Jarka (cello) (Pastor Ingrid's neighbors) will share their gifts of music.
