Dear Holy Trinity,

I'm writing this the day after the election. By the time you read it, I suspect that a lot will have changed. Or at least I hope so. As I watch states turn colors on the electoral map, I wonder aloud: What does it mean to belong? What does it mean to belong to one another?

As I reflect on these questions in this tumultuous time in our nation and in the world, I realize that belonging is more complex than I previously realized. It is multidimensional—it involves lament for past wrongdoing; resilience for the hard work of relationship; understanding that moves us from microaggressions to micro-inclusions; and celebration when we catch glimpses of the peace, hope, and love that we are promised.

Knowing that COVID-19 will keep us physically separated this year, the worship staff and I imagined something new. We hope this [Advent] box reminds you that you belong—to God and to one another. From candles and bread, to prayers and poems, to piñatas and dancin' music, we pray that Advent gives you space and time to lament, to wonder, to change, and to celebrate.

At the end of a long year and at the start of a new church year, it's good to remember that we belong to God and that nothing can separate us from that truth. Emmanuel, God with us, has made a home in our hearts, in our communities, in our nation, in our world, and in all of creation. Even now, the cries of the Christ child are awakening us, calling us, and shaping us into something new.

PIÑATAS WITH DEACON DAVID TUESDAYS, DEC. 1, 8, & 15

We will craft piñatas together on Tuesdays, December 1, 8, and 15, from 4:00 to 5:00 p.m. The Zoom sessions will be live for those who can make it and recorded for those who cannot. Instructions are included on page 28 of the Advent booklet so that everyone knows what to expect and can plan accordingly.

One of the ways Christian leaders taught the faith in the 1400s "New Spain" was by using physical objects such as the piñata. They "Christianized" a tradition that had been practiced in honor of the god Huitzilopochtli and made it into a catechism tool to be used during the season of Advent, leading up to the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ.

Piñatas were made using clay pots and were filled with all sorts of goodies. They were decorated with seven cones jutting out from the pots and resembled a star, like the one that shone above Bethlehem. The seven points also represented the deadly sins against which Christians needed to fight, and so people were given sticks with which to break the piñatas in their struggle against sin. When the piñatas would break, the treats would spill out and be enjoyed—symbolizing a Christian's heavenly reward after a lifetime of keeping the faith.

As we journey together through Advent, we will be making piñatas together and learning more about our faith. You will be able to join three live Zoom sessions, which will include crafting the piñatas and learning more about our faith! Everyone is encouraged to join, especially those who are in Confirmation classes. For those who cannot attend the live Zoom sessions, a recorded video of the session will be sent to you via email.

May this time of waiting in preparation bring joy, peace, good health, and goodness into your lives!

Each Wednesday during Advent (December 2, 9, 16), you'll receive a link via email for a recorded worship service of Holden Evening Prayer. This year, Holden will be accompanied by slides of astronomical images—magnificent and colorful photographs of planets, moons, star clusters, nebulas, comets, and galaxies. The stunning universe to which we belong is ever-changing, with light and darkness interspersed, and with clouds of gas and dust glowing in, and sometimes obscuring parts of, the night sky. We'll see panoramic views caught by the Hubble telescope of hundreds of thousands of stars in colorful clusters, vistas of planets, sights of the Milky Way streaming above the forest, and a full moon rising in the desert.

In the Holden Evening Hymn we sing, "You who made the heaven's splendor, every dancing star of night, make us shine with gentle justice, let us each reflect your light." We're invited to watch and wait, sing, pray, breathe, and reflect the light of the One who has been there from the beginning.
