SHARING FROM OUR ABUNDANCE

At the annual meeting in January, we approved the Stepping Out in Faith proposal. The Stepping Out in Faith Committee was tasked with recommending ways to disburse the funds we received as a result of the Trinity Apartments sale. The committee decided to give away 15% of the funds (\$810,000) to 8 different organizations whose work focuses on racial, economic, and social justice. Seven of the eight organizations will receive unrestricted donations of \$75,000. One of these organizations is CTUL. (www.ctul.net)

CTUL (Centro de Trabajadores Unidos en la Lucha)

CTUL began as a program of the Workers Interfaith Network (WIN) in 2007. Any low-wage worker who was facing a problem in the workplace could come to CTUL. CTUL partnered with workers through leadership development and direct action, so that workers learned about their workplace rights and how to exercise those rights to win change. Early fights included workers from Best Brands Bakery and D'Amico's.

CTUL has now expanded their organizing programs to include organizing fast food workers as part of the national Fight for \$15. One CTUL member, Guillermo Lindsay, serves on the National Organizing Committee of the Fight for \$15, making decisions about the future of the campaign.

CTUL is dedicated to a vision of an empowered community of workers, and to that end is working toward increased involvement on the part of our members in determining the direction of our organization and its programs. We see workers coming together to improve their working conditions and strengthen their circumstances as the most effective way to grow and become stronger as a group, and to convince other workers that this is a cause worth joining and a fight they can win.

CTUL's Mission

CTUL organizes low-wage workers from across the Twin Cities to develop leadership and educate one another to build power and lead the struggle for fair wages, better working conditions, basic respect, and a voice in our workplaces. CTUL is an organization *of* workers and *for* workers, committed to securing fair working conditions for present and future generations.

There are no short-term solutions to racial and economic inequity. The problems we face will not be solved by just winning one-off solutions like a \$15 minimum wage or paid sick days. We need long-term solutions that ensure worker voices help shape the decisions that impact our workplaces and our communities. We need permanent institutions of power led by working communities of color that have the vision, the capacity, and the stability to innovate, dream big, and accomplish their dreams. Through our worker-driven campaigns, CTUL is opening the space for workers to have a voice in shaping their workplaces, communities, and politics.

AARP TAX AIDE AT HOLY TRINITY

AARP Tax Aide will again be available at Holy Trinity to provide assistance with 2020 tax preparation for seniors and low-income taxpayers. Because of COVID 19 protocols, the process will be different. Here are the steps to take:

- Make an appointment to come to Holy Trinity to have your tax documents scanned. To make an appointment, have your 2019 tax return available, and call between 9:00-11:00 a.m. and 1:00-3:00 p.m.:
 - ♦ Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays call **763-245-2885**
 - ♦ Tuesdays and Thursdays call **612-203-1697**
 - ♦ **DO NOT call the church office**. They are unable to make appointments.
- Prior to your appointment, please pick up and complete an Interview Sheet which is available outside the east (cul -de-sac) door at Holy Trinity.
- Bring the completed interview sheet, your tax documents, and a mask to your appointment. Arrive at Holy Trinity no more than five minutes before your scheduled appointment. Masks are required and physical distancing of at least six feet will be enforced. A Tax Aide volunteer will review your Interview sheet and scan your tax documents. You will then be able to leave.
- Your tax return will be prepared at a later date using the online documents that were scanned. Once your tax return is completed, you will be called to set up an appointment to pick it up and sign the standard release form. Your return will then be filed electronically.
