MEET THE STAFF (AGAIN)

Today we're featuring long-time staff and HTLC member **Ann Schrooten**.

Ann's first (and only?) major failure was flunking out of tap dancing because she was too scared to ask the bigger girls to help her tie her shoes (she was only 3).

Her best job ever was when she sang for small change, free flame-broiled hamburgers, and hugs at the Cat n' Fiddle Supper Club in New Ulm, Minnesota, where her mother moonlighted at the Hammond organ on weekends.

Though Ann worked for a season at Mesa Verde National Park in Colorado when she was in her 20s, she didn't share any heroic rescues she may have undertaken during that time, but she did share her first "heroic rescue" when she discovered a big high school kid "trapped" in the historic log cabin in Lincoln Park (Fairmont, Minnesota). Ann ran to push the door open for him, only to realize (too late) that the reason for his imprisonment was a swarm of yellow jackets right over the entrance. While big high school kid emerged intact, our heroine suffered a sting to her palm. The swarm proceeded to follow Ann and her two brothers back home, where concerned neighbors appeared for an unofficial home tour when the weeping and wailing of the Schrooten children sounded more intense than usual. Fortunately, said heroine survived to share her tale of bravery.

Given the nature of the above traumatizing experience, it's a bit surprising that our heroine recently added to her many skills and talents by becoming a certified beekeeper (and so far it's going quite well as she's still without bees).

The most harrowing moment in Ann's young life came when she witnessed an armed robbery at the old Red Owl store near Hennepin and Franklin Avenues. Ann and her mother were forced to take cover in the produce aisle, behind the grapefruit display.

Eventually she overcame her food market trauma and went on to work her favorite side job—inventing sandwiches at Tim and Tom's Speedy Market while attending Luther Seminary. Unfortunately, Ann neglected to patent the popular "Gardener Sandwich" that became a vegetarian must-have in the neighborhood. Other useful skills Ann developed while working at the market included quartering whole chickens with a cleaver, and understanding the mystery of cooking and cooling hard-boiled eggs that will peel with minimal effort. Ann has agreed to share the Tim and Tom's Speedy Market boiled eggs secret:

1. Boil egg to desired doneness.
